About the Month of Nissan

Nissan, the first month on Jewish calendar (according to the Torah), coincides with March-April on the civil calendar. The Torah calls it chodesh ha-aviv—the month of spring, as it marks the beginning of the spring months. It is in this month that we celebrate the eight-day holiday of Passover, from the 15th through the 22nd of Nissan. It commemorates the Jewish people's miraculous redemption from slavery in Egypt, and the birth of the Jewish nation.



From the Rabbi

Musing about Family

Last weekend I experienced two very special events: a family reunion in Philadelphia on Saturday night and the Sons of Zion Purim Play on Sunday afternoon. These diverse events, packed into slightly more than a 24-hour

period, have got me thinking about family and connections, and I'd like to share some musings with you in this article.

The Saturday night reunion with my biological family in Philadelphia coincided with my oldest brother's 80th birthday. It was a great opportunity to get together with siblings, with the generation of our kids, and with the next generation of great-nieces and great-nephews, some of whom I was meeting for the first time. Families, even when we don't see one another very often, share a common history that enables us to reconnect and find our place in the world. And even when we meet new arrivals to the *mishpacha*, they automatically become "family/familiar."

My brother put together a show of old family pictures and videos that included my siblings and me at different ages. It also highlighted past family gatherings with pictures of our parents, grandparents, other relatives and family friends, all of whom are now deceased. Counting both the living and dead, five generations were "present." Poet Laura Gilpin wrote:

"These things I know:

How the living go on living

And how the dead go on living with them..."

I was feeling and experiencing the presence of both the living and the dead.

The reunion was a poignant reminder of the passage of time, of how one generation moves on to the next, of the power of family ties, of mortality and immortality. One of the videos my brother showed at his 80th birthday on Sunday was of a similar celebration of our father's 80th birthday thirty-five years ago. In that video, we were the age of our kids who were watching it with us today. And now we have become the age of our parents, the people

people we used to think about as being old. Time became blurred: I was both young child and older parent, all in the same intense moment.

The Purim Play the following afternoon at Sons of Zion was tremendous, unmitigated fun. While very different from the family reunion/birthday celebration I had just experienced the previous night, the shared laughter, the comfortable atmosphere, the being together with friendly people we maybe hadn't seen in a while, felt a lot like... family.

The juxtaposition of these two events this weekend reminded me that family does not have to be biological only. When our biological families may be distant, we can find that feeling of connection right here with our extended family at the synagogue. It's where we can be accepted for who we are. At SOZ we can express silliness on Purim, seriousness on Yom Kippur, and the spiritual aspects of ourselves and our souls in the melodies and sublime joy of Shabbat.

I thought I was going to experience only one family reunion last weekend in Philadelphia; now I realize that the SOZ Purim Play enabled me to take part in two joyful family reunions in the same weekend.

Looking ahead, later this month we have perhaps the most family-oriented Jewish holiday of the year: Passover. Passover is the longest-running Jewish family reunion commemorating both our birth as a people free from the oppression of physical and spiritual slavery, and the springtime rebirth of nature. Please know that your extended family at SOZ is here to celebrate with you. "Seder Together" is SOZ's way to match everyone who would like to host a guest or guests at their seder with everyone who would like to be a guest at a seder.
