


## President's Message

I am happy to report that the Board of Directors has voted unanimously to accept an offer for \$835,000 from The Lighthouse School of Holyoke for the sale of our synagogue building. We are extremely happy that this group will give our wonderful, but too large and expensive for us, building a new life. Now we have two challenges: 1. to pack up what we can take with us to a new location and 2. to find a new home for our synagogue. We also must always keep in

mind that we need to keep up the maintenance of our cemetery even as we have fewer burials since many of the families have moved away from the area. So, we need to consider do we want to just rent a space? Is it better to find something smaller and less expensive and purchase so we don't have to think about moving again for hopefully a long time? Our future planning committee is working hard to try to find an answer that works for everyone. It won't be easy, but with your help, we can continue to be the wonderful Jewish community that so many of us treasure. In the meantime, we continue to have activities to keep us together if not in person, at least in spirit. Our shabbat services are well attended and we always have a minyan for our Wednesday afternoon service. We also continue to attract new members to our warm and welcoming shul. With warmer weather coming we hope to be able to see you in person again if Covid, which is unfortunately surging in our area again, finally abates. I welcome your suggestions as always!

# SOZ BOOK CLUB MEETING Sunday, March 5<sup>th</sup> at 10:30am



#### All Other Nights by Dara Horn

How is tonight different from all other nights? For Jacob Rappaport, a Jewish soldier in the Union army during the Civil War, it is a question his commanders have already answered for him—on Passover, 1862, he is ordered to murder his own uncle in New Orleans, who is plotting to assassinate President Lincoln. After this harrowing mission, Jacob is recruited to pursue another enemy agent, the daughter of a Virginia family friend. But this time, his assignment isn't to murder the spy, but to marry her. Their marriage, with its riveting and horrifying consequences,

reveals the deep divisions that still haunt American life today.

Based on real personalities such as Judah Benjamin, the Confederacy's Jewish secretary of state and spymaster, and on historical facts and events ranging from an African American spy network to the dramatic self-destruction of the city of Richmond, *All Other Nights* is a gripping and suspenseful story of men and women driven to the extreme limits of loyalty and betrayal. It is also a brilliant parable of the rift in America that lingers a century and a half later: between those who value family and tradition first, and those dedicated, at any cost, to social and racial justice for all.

In this eagerly awaited third novel, award-winning author Dara Horn brings us page-turning storytelling at its best. Layered with meaning, *All Other Nights* reinvents the most American of subjects with originality and insight.




