Hanukkah Blessings

Candles are added to the *hanukkiyah* (menorah) from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first.

Light the *shamash* (the helper candle) first, using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights. As you do, say or sing:

בָּרוּדְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשְׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו, וְצִוָּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק נֵר שֶׁל חֲנֵכָּה.

Baruch aaah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu I'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzov, commanding us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יִיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁעָשָׂה נִסִּים לַאֲבוֹתֵינוּ וְאִמוֹתֵינוּ בַּיָּמִים הָהֵם בַּוְּמֵן הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, she-asah nisim laavoteinu v'imoteinu bayamim hahaeim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors in days of old at this season.

For first night only:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יָיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁהֶחֱיָנוּ וְקִיְּמְנוּ וָהָגִּיעַנוּ לַזִּמֵן הַזֵּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higiyanu laz'man hazeh. Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who has kept us alive, sustained us, and brought us to this season.

On Erev Shabbat, Friday evening, December 11th, light the Hanukkah candles first followed by Shabbat Candles.

We kindle these lights because of the wondrous deliverance You performed for our ancestors. During these eight days of Hanukkah, these lights are sacred; we are not to use them but only to behold them, so that their glow may rouse us to give thanks for Your wondrous acts of deliverance.



SOZ BOOK CLUB MEETING

Sunday, December 13, 2020 at 10:30am



A thought-provoking novel that tells the riveting story of a daughter of Holocaust survivors who travels to Russia on business shortly after the fall of communism and finds herself embroiled in a perilous mafia conspiracy that could irrevocably destroy her life.

Brooke Fielding, a thirty-eight year old New York investment manager and daughter of Jewish Holocaust survivors, finds her life suddenly upended in late September 1993 when her job is in jeopardy. Brooke accepts an invitation to join a friend on a mission to Moscow to teach entrepreneurial skills to Russian business women, which will also give her a chance to gain expertise in this vast new emerging market. Though excited by the chance to save her job and be one of the first Americans to visit Russia after the fall

of communism, she also wonders what awaits her in the country that persecuted her mother just a generation ago.

Inspired by the women she meets, Brooke becomes committed to helping them investigate the business crime that threatens their businesses. But as the uprising of the Russian parliament against President Boris Yeltsin turns Moscow into a volatile war zone, Brooke will find that her involvement comes at a high cost. For in a city where "capitalism" is still a dirty word, where neighbors spy on neighbors, and the new economy is in the hands of a few dangerous men, nothing Brooke does goes unnoticed—and a mistake in her past may now compromise her future.

Mollie Goldberg's Potato Latkes

4 medium-large potatoes (Russet)

1 medium-large onion (according to your taste)

Salt to taste

1/4 tsp freshly ground black pepper

1 large or x-large egg, beaten

3 tbsp potato starch or flour

1/2 tsp baking powder

1/2 cup or 1/4 inch oil

- 1. Peel, grate and drain potatoes. Cover peeled potatoes with cold water until grated. Be sure to dry the potato well before grating.
- 2. Wrap grated potatoes in cloth kitchen towel and twist as hard as you can to drain. Or...line a fine strainer with cheesecloth and drain (twisting may help here). What remains on the cheesecloth is potato starch and can be used in the latke.
- 3. Mix potato, onion, salt, pepper, egg, potato starch, and baking powder WELL.
- 4. Heat the oil in the skillet. A tiny test of potato should sizzle. Make in batches. 1 tbsp makes small latkes; heaping tbsp makes a larger latke; serving spoon is larger (you get it).
- 5. Flatten with a spatula. Cook 3-5 minutes 'til edges are brown and latke looks solid. Flip. Both sides should be brown.
- 6. Drain well on paper towels.
- 7. Serve as a side dish or main dish with a salad.
- 8. Serve with apple sauce or sour cream.

How to Watch SOZ's Past Shabbat Services on YouTube:

(Zoom services are not recorded)

Turn on your computer and speakers.

- 1. Run an internet browser (Internet Explorer or Chrome, for example)
- 2. Type youtube.com in the navigation bar and press enter.
- 3. In YouTube, type Congregation Sons of Zion (not just "Sons of Zion") in the box that says Search and them click on the magnifying glass or press enter.
- 4. Click on the video that has a red "Live" button on the bottom right corner. It may take up to 45 seconds for the video to load.

Services start at 10:00am. Shabbat Shalom!

Cemetery Rules

- 1. Synagogue member in good standing for at least 5 years prior to death are entitled to a free plot
- 2. Plot fee for non-members is \$4,500. Plot for a spouse on a double lot is \$2,250.
- 3. Opening and closing of grave is \$800
- 4. Perpetual care is \$1,500.
- 5. Cremated remains are permitted. Digging of hole for urn or ashes is \$100 in addition to the plot fee (instead of a grave fee).

Non-Jewish spouses or family members will be buried in a separate plot (no non-Jewish religious symbols are allowed).

No concrete vaults are allowed. Simple, unfinished wood caskets only.

Taharah-ritual Jewish washing and shroud are required, but a shomer or watch person is optional.

A particular plot may be reserved for \$100. There are several plots in the new section that were previously reserved and are now unused. Please call for more details.
