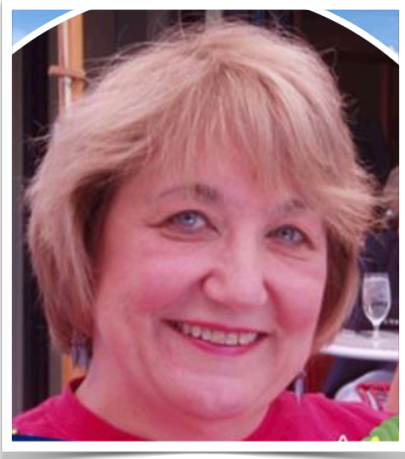

President's Message

As we head into the High Holidays, I wish you all good health in the coming year and an easy fast on Yom Kippur. Since our closing on the sale of the building will not be until November, we can happily spend several more days in our beautiful sanctuary. If anyone is interested, the theater-type seats are available for free. There are seven seats in each row, and we have many rows. The stained-glass windows are available also-at the cost for removal and replacement, which is about \$2000.

They are truly beautiful works of art and can be just framed rather than installed. Actual measurements available upon request. We hope to raise enough money to take several of them with us. Three of the eleven windows have been claimed so far. Nine of them have memorial names at the bottom or top, and two do not. There are also several filing cabinets, desks, and other pieces of furniture, as well as kitchen equipment, which will be available in the small social hall. We have hundreds of books that we cannot keep, and they will be available-so take a look before or after the services. We will be holding an open house in October after the High Holidays-date to be announced.

As for our future home, nothing has been decided, but we may be renting a temporary space in order to figure out our budget and see what we can afford. The need to ensure the cemetery endowment fund has enough money to sustain it will be of paramount concern.

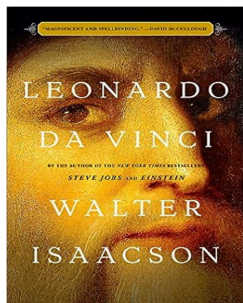

Leonardo Da Vinci by Walter Isaacson

The #1 New York Times bestseller from Walter Isaacson brings Leonardo da Vinci to life in this exciting new biography that is “a study in creativity: how to define it, how to achieve it...Most important, it is a powerful story of an exhilarating mind and life” (The New Yorker).

Based on thousands of pages from Leonardo da Vinci’s astonishing notebooks and new discoveries about his life and work, Walter Isaacson “deftly reveals an intimate Leonardo” (*San Francisco Chronicle*) in a narrative that connects his art to his science. He shows how Leonardo’s genius was

based on skills we can improve in ourselves, such as passionate curiosity, careful observation, and an imagination so playful that it flirted with fantasy.

He produced the two most famous paintings in history, *The Last Supper* and the *Mona Lisa*. With a passion that sometimes became obsessive, he pursued innovative studies of anatomy, fossils, birds, the heart, flying machines, botany, geology, and weaponry. He explored the math of optics, showed how light rays strike the cornea, and produced illusions of changing perspectives in *The Last Supper*. His ability to stand at the crossroads of the humanities and the sciences, made iconic by his drawing of *Vitruvian Man*, made him history’s most creative genius.

In the “luminous” (*Daily Beast*) *Leonardo da Vinci*, Isaacson describes how Leonardo’s delight at combining diverse passions remains the ultimate recipe for creativity. So, too, does his ease at being a bit of a misfit: illegitimate, gay, vegetarian, left-handed, easily distracted, and at times heretical. His life should remind us of the importance to be imaginative and, like talented rebels in any era, to think different. Here, da Vinci “comes to life in all his remarkable brilliance and oddity in Walter Isaacson’s ambitious new biography...a vigorous, insightful portrait” (*The Washington Post*).

Cemetery Rules

1. Synagogue member in good standing for at least 5 years prior to death are entitled to a free plot
2. Plot fee for non-members is \$4,500. Plot for a spouse on a double lot is \$2,250.
3. Opening and closing of grave is \$800
4. Perpetual care is \$1,500.
5. Cremated remains are permitted. Digging of hole for urn or ashes is \$100 in addition to the plot fee (instead of a grave fee).

Non-Jewish spouses or family members will be buried in a separate plot (no non-Jewish religious symbols are allowed).

No concrete vaults are allowed. Simple, unfinished wood caskets only.

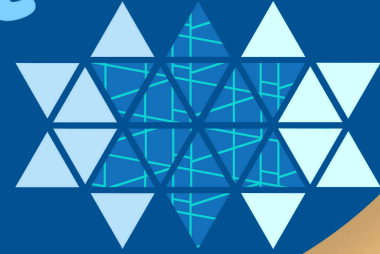
Taharah-ritual Jewish washing and shroud are required, but a shomer or watch person is optional.

A particular plot may be reserved for \$100. There are several plots in the new section that were previously reserved and are now unused. Please call for more details.

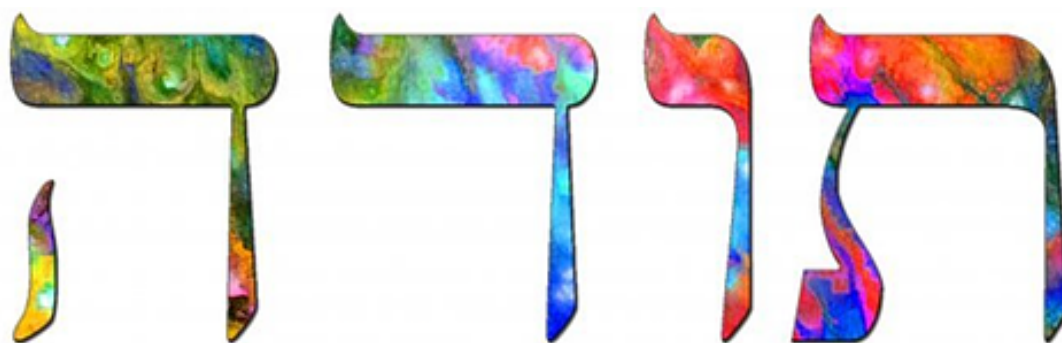

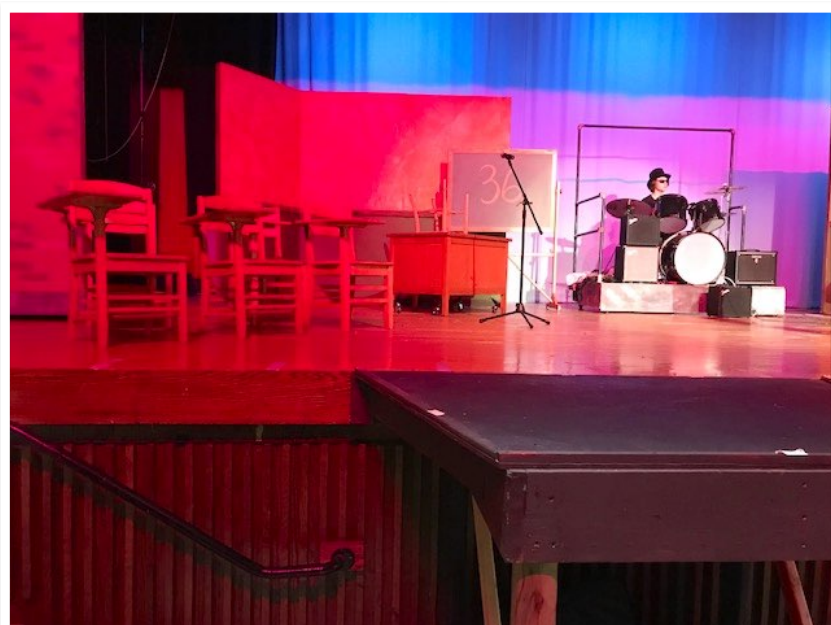
