

Consequently, needing somewhere to go we have rented a relatively small space in Holyoke in the newly renovated mills by the canal. It has just about enough space for our activities and is very reasonably priced. It is also very secure with a keypad lock, lots of lights and we can take our security cameras. It will give

us a place to go while we ponder our future plans. We will send some pictures after we have made the move.

There will be an open house on November 5 at the synagogue (and probably another one later) for our members and friends to come and take lots of the items that we will no longer be needing as we downsize from 19,000 square feet. Donations will be happily accepted. We are sad to be leaving this 100+ year old building with so many memories but will not miss the expense of keeping it up. And we are so happy that the Lighthouse School will be giving it new life and full use again.

Wanting to take the stained glass windows in the large sanctuary with us, we have started a Go Fund Me page (details on Page 5). Three of the windows have already been claimed by descendants of the original donors. We have an agreement with the school that we can take them after the sale since they need to be replaced with appropriate windows. Hopefully this will happen by the spring. The school is doing extensive renovations and is planning to open next September. We will be storing a lot of the things that we feel we really will need in the future but have no place for right now.

The name change project which has been on hold will be resumed, since we have a new and exciting future and Sons of Zion does not reflect who we are. Hope to see you at 380R Dwight St., Unit 5, in the future!



Horse by Geraldine Brooks

Kentucky, 1850. An enslaved groom named Jarret and a bay foal forge a bond of understanding that will carry the horse to recordsetting victories across the South. When the nation erupts in civil war, an itinerant young artist who has made his name on paintings of the racehorse takes up arms for the Union. On a perilous night, he reunites with the stallion and his groom, very far from the glamor of any racetrack.

New York City, 1954. Martha Jackson, a gallery owner celebrated for taking risks on edgy contemporary painters, becomes obsessed with a nineteenth-century equestrian oil painting of mysterious provenance.

Washington, DC, 2019. Jess, a Smithsonian scientist from Australia, and Theo, a Nigerian-American art historian, find themselves unexpectedly connected through their shared interest in the horse–one studying the stallion's bones for clues to his power and endurance, the other uncovering the lost history of the unsung Black horsemen who were critical to his racing success.

Based on the remarkable true story of the record-breaking thoroughbred Lexington, *Horse* is a novel of art and science, love and obsession, and our unfinished reckoning with racism.


