President's Message

Sons of Zion Annual Meeting - June 29, 2025

President's Message

Three years ago, I took on the job as your President with the goal of selling our building at 378 Maple Street and securing the future of our synagogue and especially our cemetery which is dear to my heart after 20 years as its chairman. One year ago, we were devastated by the cancellation of the sale of the building to the Lighthouse

School. It has been a difficult year hoping to find a new buyer and managing to keep our shul active and growing. We have engaged a new agent and there is a lot of activity presently. Hopefully we will succeed in getting a buyer for this building which is costing us more to keep than the wonderful space here that we rent.

We were unable to afford to pay our dear Rabbi Saul Perlmutter but since the High Holidays last year have continued to get a minyan for our services with the fine work of our lay leaders Dr. Max Chorowski, Joe Boucher, Randi Stein, Nitza Seaver, and Jayne Pearl. We have also enjoyed having occasional services led by our former Rabbi, the now retired but still very vibrant Marc Rudolph.

We are a group of 60-90 year-olds who are only getting older. Joan Rosner, (who is a few years older than me) after serving as President for 5 years has continued to be my most active helper and co-chairman of the Religious Committee, shopping and setting up the kiddush after services, and advising me whenever I need it. Lois Levin who is retired but still works part time has done a great job as treasurer and picked up the slack when we didn't have a secretary. Rich Freyman, although still working full time, serves as co-Chair of the Religious Committee and makes sure our Zoom services are available. Dr. Stephen Levine who was a past President for 20 years, has been a great help with his unflagging enthusiasm and ideas.

Unfortunately, the younger generation today is not interested in traditional Judaism. They don't attend a 2-hour Shabbat service. They want to remain Jewish, with the traditions and holidays but are not there for the everyday work of keeping a synagogue going. The one exception is our wonderful new Cemetery Chairman, Eitan Kenefick, who at age 35 has taken on the job of securing the future of our cemetery and done a great job. I wish we had a few more like him. The cemetery needs to be funded and taken care of for the future when we are not around. The plan is to put money from the sale of the building into a fund that will

continue to support it. One of our members has agreed to match up to \$250,000 of a fund raiser for the cemetery.

At this point, our synagogue has about 70 members of which a core of about 20 are really active members. It's a wonderful group of people and I love them dearly but the most active of them are between 60 and 88 years old. The synagogue cannot continue to depend on us. At age 80, I am feeling the toll that the stress of this job has had on me. For the first time in many years, I have been laid low with a virus. (never had Covid, thankfully) but I am more tired, more easily. I took on the job as your President with the goal of selling the building and securing our future but I will not be President again after this coming year.

I feel if the building has not sold by the end of September that we should auction it off and take what we can get. This is my notice to see if we can increase our active membership and keep our warm and welcoming synagogue thriving. I know it is happening to religious organizations everywhere. A member of Sinai Temple told me they sometimes have trouble getting a minyan and are feeling the burden of supporting a large building that is not used as often as it once was. We need to think about how we can continue to keep the traditions in a changing world.

I first came to Sons of Zion with my stepson's Bar Mitzvah training in 1996. The wonderful warm group of people here that I have grown to love and cherish deserve to thrive and continue. If everyone did a little bit, it wouldn't be a lot of work. Looking for your ideas and support.


