President's Message

I never really wanted to be President of this synagogue, but four years ago I agreed to serve as President of Sons of Zion with two goals in mind: the sale of our large building at 378 Maple St. and the future protection of our cemetery. Although the building was beloved by our members for its beautiful sanctuary, stained-glass windows, and custom-carved woodwork, it was costing us far more to maintain than we were taking in.

The membership of the synagogue was declining as members died or moved away. The new members who joined could not support us in the same way as before.

The building was also aging. The sanctuary itself dates back to a French-Canadian Hall built in the late 1800s and remodeled into a synagogue in 1915. The Jewish Community Center addition dates to 1950. Selling a large building that needed a great deal of work was not easy. In 2022, we put the building up for sale, and it was ultimately sold for \$550,000. Compared to recent sales of other large, aging buildings, this price seems fair.

It was a monumental task to move all of the contents out of the building. I would like to thank everyone who worked with me to accomplish this task, with a very special thanks to David Scher, whose assistance was invaluable. We were also fortunate that the new owners of the building, Templo Pentecostal, agreed that many of our unneeded metal chairs and numerous other items could be left behind.

Fortunately, many of our members have given more than the minimum and have even become Sustainers. However, our total income simply has not kept pace with the expenses of running a synagogue.

Most of our members are over 60, and the majority of our active membership is over 70. Our active members are enthusiastic and deeply committed. But, as of now, there is no one to take their place. In only a few years, it appears that we will be in trouble.

I did not want to continue as President of this synagogue because I have an ailing husband. I am grateful that two of our Board members have stepped up to share the position of Vice President in order to decrease my responsibilities.

We do have a major responsibility, and that is our cemetery. Our Board has recently demonstrated unanimous support for our cemetery by funding improvements, as described in the Cemetery Committee's report. We must continue to develop our Cemetery Committee so that it will be better able to maintain the cemetery, make improvements as needed, and conduct funerals to help assure our cemetery's future.

President's Message (continued)

If we are to maintain the cemetery properly, it is going to need additional income. We should seriously address this need by assigning a portion of the proceeds from the sale of the Maple Street property to increase our cemetery's endowment fund at the Jewish Endowment Foundation.

I have to give a big thank you to my Board of Directors, who have donated their time and money to keeping us going. I especially want to thank our treasurer, Lois Levin, who, after many years of doing the difficult job of serving as synagogue secretary and keeping the records of all our meetings, took on the additional responsibility of becoming treasurer.

Dr. Stephen Levine, after serving as President for 20 years, has been an invaluable member of the Board. He chaired the Bylaws Revision Committee and tirelessly worked to complete the revisions that we vote on today.

Joan Rosner, after serving five years as President, has continued as Co-Chair of the Religious Committee and single-handedly prepares the wonderful Kiddush that we enjoy after our in-person services. I have asked her countless times to submit a bill for her expenses, but I still haven't seen one.

Our office manager, Tara Neddeau, takes care of our wonderful newsletter, sends all the yahrzeit and other notices, does the bookkeeping, and, in general, keeps us going. And she hasn't had a raise in pay in over five years.

Last but certainly not least, thank you to our relatively new member, Jayne Pearl, who has inspired us in many ways by chairing the Activities Committee and serving as Secretary of the Board of Directors.

Please be aware that, as a result of Jayne Pearl's creativity and leadership skills, our Activities Committee has lined up a series of activities, several of which are directed toward unaffiliated youth.

One bright light is that, going forward, we will be saving approximately \$4,000 per month, which adds up to \$48,000 per year—the amount it had cost to maintain our Maple Street property before it was sold.

In summary, we are facing many obstacles, and we must do our best to overcome them.

Thanks so much to all of you who have stuck by us!

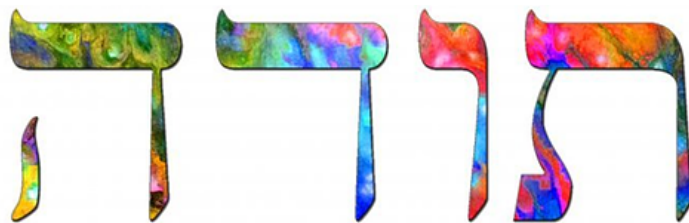
